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
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# Excellence in Fire and Emergency Awards Winners

We are delighted to announce the winners of the inaugural Excellence in Fire and Emergency Awards. The EFEs were a celebration of innovative working practices, initiatives, partnerships and technology in the fire and emergency services, so we would like to congratulate all the winners for exhibiting best practice in their field and thank all those who entered for continuing to develop fire and emergency practice.

## Innovation of the Year

(sponsored by Holmatro)



The Innovation of the Year Award will be given to an individual or team that has developed innovative technology or a way of working that has made a significant difference to fire and emergency performance and delivery. The winner will demonstrate one or more of the following: improved safety measures which have led to saving lives and reducing injuries, produced significant cost savings, and improved the provision of emergency response.

## Winner:

### Care Consulting – Innohome Stove Guard System

Over 50 per cent of domestic fires start in the kitchen – the most dangerous place in the house. Finnish company Innohome have cleverly designed a proven innovative system to monitor the activities of cooking on the hob and will alert and prevent potential fires from this source. The Stove Guard system has won a number of awards; it has been independently and successfully tested by Sinteff, a research laboratory in Scandinavia.

## Partnership of the Year

(sponsored by FIRE magazine)



The Partnership of the Year Award will be presented to a fire or emergency individual or team that has participated in a partnership(s) which has made a discernible improvement to the community they serve. The winner will demonstrate innovation and ingenuity, providing best practice and best value, and showing flexible and effective working practices.

## Winner:

### Dorset Fire and Rescue Service – Safe and Independent Living (SAIL)

Dorset SAIL went live in 2010 and is active across Dorset, Bournemouth, and Poole. The scheme was designed to bring services to members of the community through a “one stop” referral form that could be completed by any partner visiting a home or meeting the public at an event. There are over 70 referral partners involved in this scheme, with the past 12 months seeing over 1,500 referral forms completed resulting in over 4,000 actions/support.



## Supplier of the Year

(sponsored by FRESA Council of FIA)



The Supplier of the Year Award will be presented to a fire or emergency supplier whose products or services have made a significant impact upon improving efficiency and life safety. The winner will demonstrate one or more of the following: achieving significant efficiencies and cost savings, changing and improving the lives of members of the community, helping to reduce deaths and injuries.

## Winner:

### APD – Northamptonshire Police – ARTEMIS

ARTEMIS uses state-of-the-art vehicle telemetry to provide vehicle location information and monitor vehicle attributes. This data is used to provide simple and effective feedback to the driver and is also transmitted to the ARTEMIS central servers at the Force's own IT centre. ARTEMIS includes a comprehensive set of reports detailing driver behaviour and utilisation of vehicles with the ability to link into Force Business Intelligence, Control Room and Fleet Management systems. The ARTEMIS solution is designed to realise increases in efficiency through improvements in driver behaviour, vehicle management and resource utilisation.



## Training Provider of the Year

(sponsored by PrimeTech)



The Training Provider of the Year Award will be presented to an individual, organisation or team that has delivered exceptional training for fire and emergency personnel. The winner will demonstrate transference of learning, exceptional feedback, organisational improvements directly linked to the training, and innovation and best practice.

### UCLAN Fire Team – Educating Fire Professionals for Fire Safety Design, Fire Risk Management and Emergency Response

The Division of Fire and Safety Engineering at the University of Central Lancashire have developed a leading position in the United Kingdom and overseas with respect to the delivery of taught undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Fire Safety Engineering, Management and leadership studies. The fire programmes are delivered at the University of Central Lancashire at Preston campus and at various partner institutions, such as, International College of Engineering and Management, Oman and City University of Hong Kong.

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## Project of the Year

## Winner:

### Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service – Progression Pathway

GMFRS have developed a provision to engage, include and provide their communities with opportunities and experiences to develop the values, behaviours, skills and qualifications necessary to gain employment. GMFRS engages with school leavers through a range of initiatives including the Prince's Trust and volunteering – schemes which will help them to develop the values, behaviours, skills and qualifications necessary to gain employment. In 2014, GMFRS became a trailblazer for the government by launching a traineeship scheme in partnership with the National Apprenticeship Service, Skills for Fire and Rescue and learning providers.

## Winner:

### West Midlands Fire and Rescue Service – Research and Investigation Section

This year the West Midlands Fire Service (WMFS) Fire Research and Investigation Section (FRIS) celebrate its 31st anniversary. They were the first dedicated fire investigation team in the UK, the first to have a dedicated Fire Investigation Dog Team (FIDT) and the first team in the UK to carry out investigations for another fire and rescue service in their region. Over the 31 years, FRIS have made an outstanding contribution to the organisation, police and criminal services by investigating over 11,700 incidents.

## Winner:

### Ronnie King OBE

Ronnie King OBE served as a Chief Fire Officer in Mid and West Wales for close to twenty years, having previously served in West Yorkshire, London, Fife, and the Fire Service Inspectorate. He retired in 2003 after 41 years in the Fire and Rescue Service.

For the past ten years Ronnie has been more active than ever in the fire world, campaigning tirelessly for improvements in fire safety standards. He has won the respect and affection of all his peers and is seen as an ambassador for Fire UK, bringing disparate parties together through a number of high profile roles.

From a lifetime's experience dedicated to the UK Fire and Rescue Service and improving fire safety provision, Ronnie King is a living legend and worthy recipient of the inaugural Excellence in Fire and Emergency Lifetime Achievement Award.



## Team of the Year
